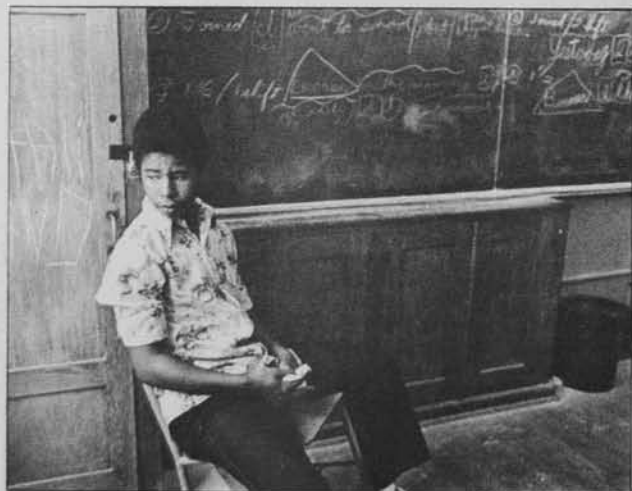

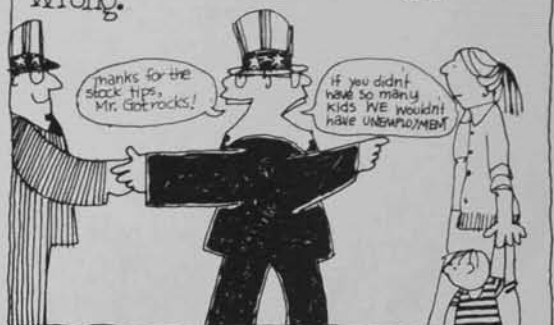

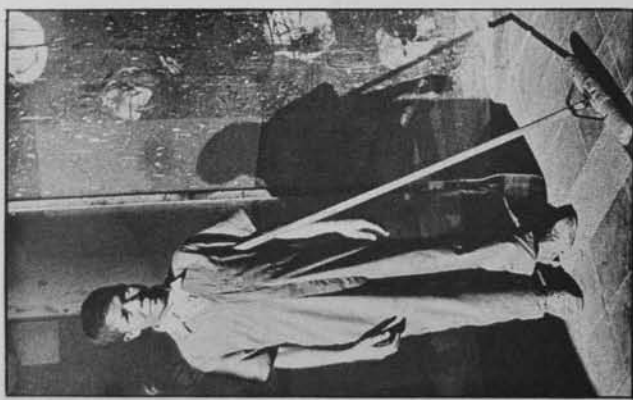
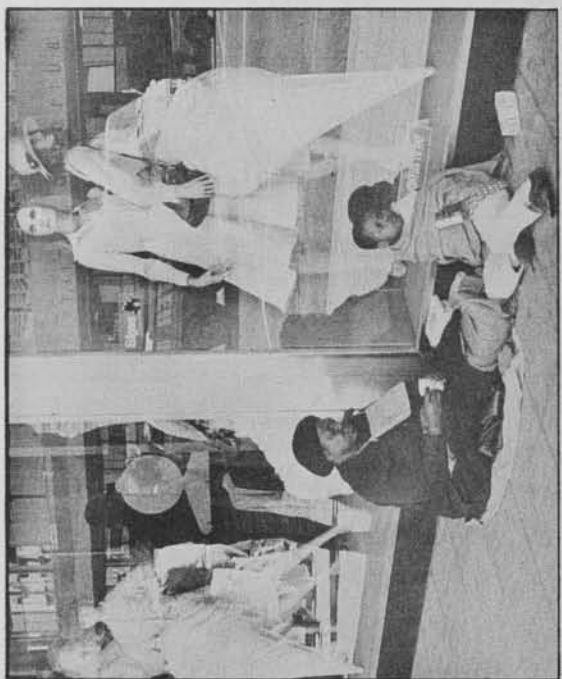
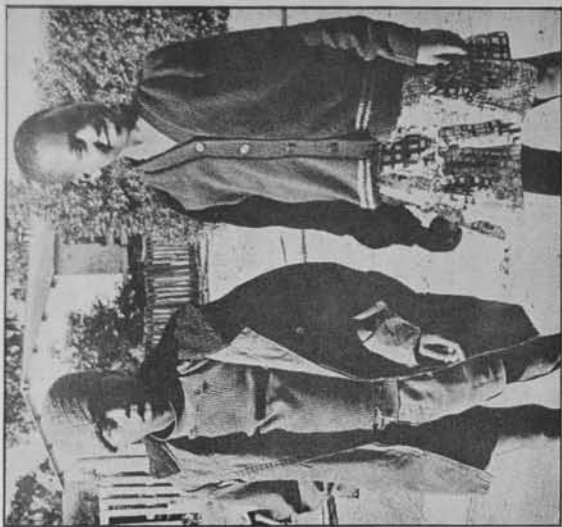

These children are among a very small percentage of black children who are able to attend preschool while their parents work. The government spends little on black education, and the preschool is sponsored by charities. Parents also have to pay some tuition and most cannot afford it.

MIDDLE LEFT: This child has brought this blind woman to beg from the white shoppers in the downtown section of East London, South Africa.

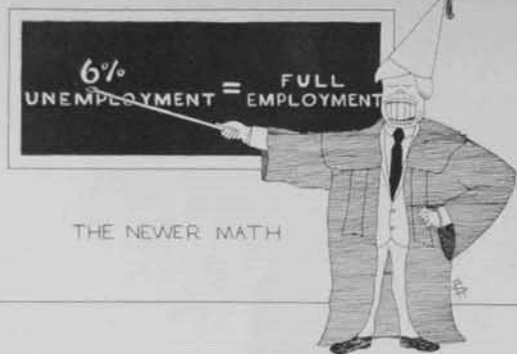

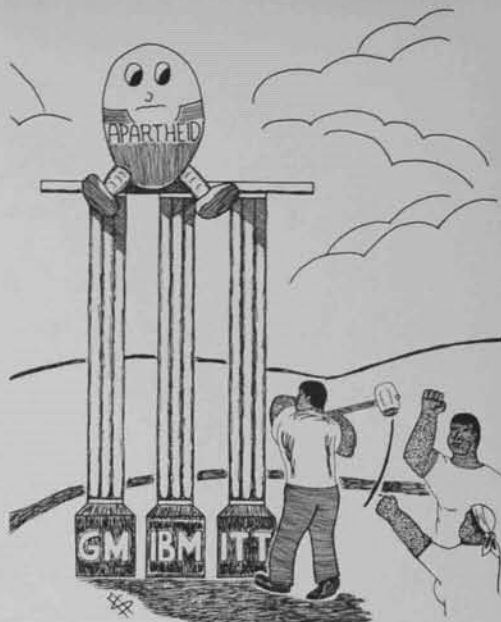

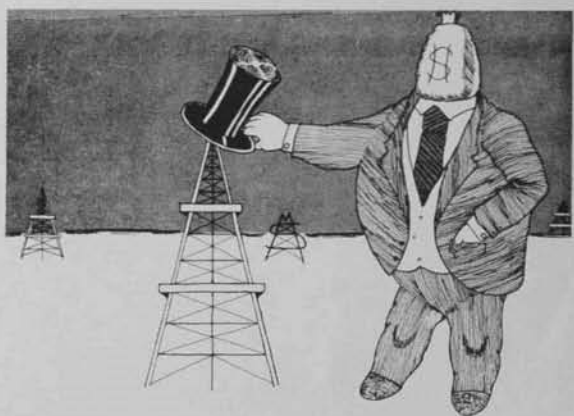
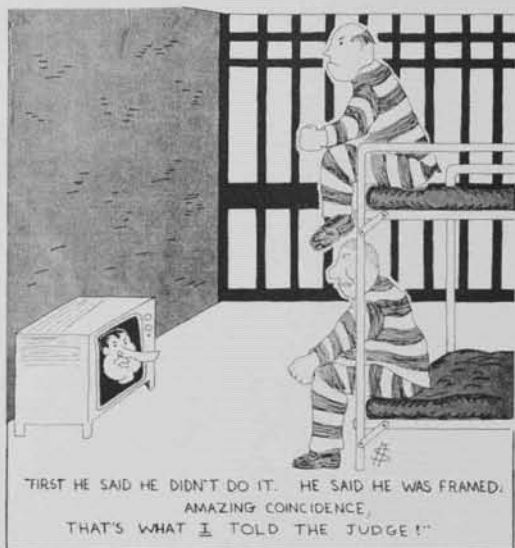

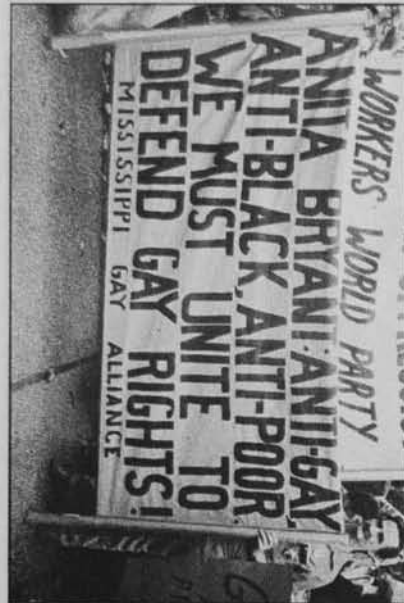
